Show Rules:

Exhibitors wishing to enter must bring in entries between 12 pm and 1pm.

No late entries will be accepted. You must be a member to exhibit in the flower show. Exhibitors must supply own containers\vases.

Exhibitor may enter up to 3 different cultivars in the Cultural Division 1, Sections A,B, and C. Please name the cultivar if known.

Design Division allows only 1 entry per class by individual exhibitor.

Judging starts promptly at 1:15pm. Judges decision is final.

Reception and viewing are following the General Meeting.

Prizes\Awards

Ribbons: First, Second, Third, Honourable Mention

Judge's Choice Awards: Best Tulip, Best Cultivar, Best Houseplant, Best Floral Design, Best Youth Exhibit and Best in Show.

Mabel White Award - Best Tulip

Prizes: \$5 each for Judge's Choices in:

Best Floral Design and Best in Show. and most points accumulated by an exhibitor (1st, 2nd, 3rd)

Division 1 - Cultural

Section A - Bulbs

Note: no foliage with Narcissus but leave the spathe on (beige sheath) Tulipa is exhibited with one set (2) leaves.

1. Hyacinthus - any colour - 1 bloom
2. Muscari - any colour - 3 stems
3. Narcissus (Daffodil) - Large cup, any colour - 1 scape
4. Narcissus (Daffodil) - small cup, any colour - 1 scape
5. Narcissus (Daffodil) - double (*one or more flowers to a stem with doubling of perianth segments (surrounding petals) or the corona or both*) any colour - 1 scape
6. Narcissus (Daffodil) - same cultivar - 3 scapes (uniformity between cultivars is very important, same height, stage of freshness etc.)
7. Tulipa - single, any colour - 1 bloom
8. Tulipa - double, any colour - 1 bloom
9. Tulipa - any other specialized cultivar - 1 bloom
10. Tulipa - any colour, any cultivar - 5-7 blooms (should have minimum 2 different colours)
11. Any other Spring Bulb - 1 stem

Note: Mabel White Award is given to Judge's Choice - Best Tulip.

Tips: Bulb exhibits should have stems as straight as possible and grooming (removing dirt etc.) is very important to maximize points in judging.

Section B - Cut Specimens

12. Aquilegia (Columbine) any colour - 1 stem
13. Anemone - any colour - 3 stems
14. Convallaria (Lily of the Valley) with foliage - 3 stems
15. Dicentra (Bleeding Heart) any colour - 1 stem
16. Gomphrena globosa (Globe flower) - 3 stems
17. Iris - Tall Bearded, any colour - 1 stalk
18. Iris - Beardless, Siberian - 1 stalk

- 19. Polygonatum (Solomon's Seal) - 1 stem
- 20. Primula - may be different colours - 3 stems
- 21. Flowering Branch - (maximum length 24") - 1 branch
- 22. any other specimen - 1 stem
- 23. Collection of spring flowers and their foliage (no bulbs) - minimum 3 cultivars - 5-7 stems

JUDGES CHOICE AWARD FOR BEST CULTIVAR

Section C - Houseplants

- 24. Cactus or Succulent - 1 plant
- 25. Houseplant grown for foliage - 1 plant
- 26. Houseplant grown for bloom - 1 plant

JUDGE'S CHOICE AWARD FOR BEST HOUSEPLANT

Division 2 - Design

Theme; "Spring is in the Air"

- 27. "Leafing Out" - a foliage design
- 28. "Bud's a Bursting" - a small design
- 29. "Raindrops keep Falling" - a water-viewing design
- 30. You Create a Title - an interpretation of your title. Display a title card.
- 31. "Spring's Tiny Treasures - a fresh miniature design

Novice Class

Novice = An exhibitor who has never placed 1st in a flower show design class

- 32. You Create a Title - an interpretation of your title. Display a title card.

JUDGE'S CHOICE AWARD FOR BEST DESIGN

Division 3 - Youth

Theme - "Spring is in the Air"

YOUTH (under the age of 15) Your grandchildren or neighbours' children or grandchildren are welcome to enter. (membership not required)

- 33. A Spring flower in a vase (grown from a bulb) - 1 bloom
- 34. A Spring flower in a vase (not a bulb) - 1 stem
- 35. A collection of foliage in a vase - minimum 3 different types - 5-7 stems\branches

JUDGE'S CHOICE AWARD FOR BEST YOUTH EXHIBIT

Design Notes:

Foliage Design - A design in which foliage predominates. (OJES p. 140)

Small Design - A design from 5.5" to 10" (14 cm to 25.4 cm) must not exceed 10" (25.4 cm) in height, width or depth, including any container, base and/or accessories. (OJES p. 150)

Water-viewing Design - A traditional line design with a dominant line of plant material and great use of space, in a shallow container with $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{2}{3}$ of the container surface showing water. (OJES p. 156)

Miniature Design - A design with maximum dimensions no more than 5" (12.7 cm) in height, width or depth, including any container, base and/or accessories. (OJES p. 145)
